LEGISLATIVE

The committee met in the fall to finalize our Legislative Priorities and plan our visits with legislators. Members of the committee were able to meet with almost all of the Henrico delegates and senators to discuss our 2019 priorities. Those representatives we did not meet with were sent letters and emails with our priorities.

Committee members also attended the VRTA Lobby Day at the Virginia General Assembly. That day we met with five Henrico delegates to discuss educational issues. Our State Legislative Chair, Bea Morris coordinated the events of the day. VRTA members were introduced and recognized in both the House and the Senate.

2019 Legislative Priorities

Safeguarding and improving the quality of life of retired school personnel

Any changes made to the current VRS retirement plans should be carefully studied to minimize their impact on the unfunded liability.

Provide the health insurance credit for all retired school support personnel.

Supporting and improving public education

Support local school boards authority of charter schools

Protect the SOQ and fully fund it

Fund salaries at a level that ensures teaching as a viable career

Fund salaries for all teachers at no less than the national average

Expand recruitment and retention of teachers

Respect local school boards authority to establish their own school calendars

Oppose vouchers and expansion of tuition tax credits

Reinstate funding for capital improvements of public schools

Pass an amendment to end gerrymandering Ratify the ERA amendment

LEGISLATIVE (cont'd.)

So how did we do in the 2019 General Assembly?

As of this writing, the General Assembly had adjourned and bills are awaiting the governor's signature.

The bill that would have given health insurance credits to all school employees was tabled in the House Subcommittee on a 4-3 vote. We will continue to fight for this.

A bill to allow local school boards to determine their school calendar was passed.

A 5% raise for teachers was put in the state budget.

The legislators added \$26 million to the budget for at risk schools.

School discipline reform was passed to ensure students were in class.

Many school safety measures were passed, including added counselors, clarifying the role of law enforcement in school, and investing in school safety infrastructure.

ERA was voted down.

An independent group was appointed to end gerrymandering and draw new voting districts.



Directions to Willow Oaks Country Club

<u>From Northside:</u> From I-95 heading South, take Exit 79 for 195 South-Powhite Parkway exit. Follow 195 South across the James River to the first exit-Forest Hill Avenue. Bear right after passing through the \$.75 toll onto Forest Hill Avenue. Travel 100 yards to entrance on the right.

<u>From Southside</u>: Take Chippenham Parkway to Forest Hill Avenue East exit. Travel East on Forest Hill Avenue approximately 1 mile to the entrance on the left. If you cross the railroad tracks you have gone too far.

<u>From West End:</u> Take 195 South-Powhite Parkway exit. Follow 195 South across the James River to the first exit - Forest Hill Avenue. Bear right after passing through the \$.75 toll onto Forrest Hill Avenue. Travel 100 yards to the entrance on the right.

From East End: Take I-64 West to Richmond. Follow signs to I-95 North/I-64 West (stay in far right land). Travel I-95 North approximately 1 mile and exit I-95 for Powhite Parkway (195 South) and I-64 West. Exit to the left to 195 South. Follow 195 South to the first exit across the James River-Forest Hill Avenue. Bear right after passing through the \$.75 toll onto Forrest Hill Avenue. Travel 100 yards to the entrance on the right.
