

# REMEMBRANCE

Since our last newsletter, there were 28 obituary notices of HCPS colleagues. Of those 28, 1 was an active HRSPA member, 10 were inactive members, 8 had never joined HRSPA, and 9 were not in our database or were not yet retired or may not have retired from HCPS. HRSPA acknowledgements are made to funeral home online services (16) or with cards by postal service (7). Because so many deaths are now not being serviced by funeral homes or because the family or address information we have is outdated or unavailable (3), we often do not have a place to send HRSPA condolences, and sometimes the ones mailed are often returned to us.

HRSPA will always need to fill officer and committee chair positions, so <u>Please</u> consider getting more involved in HRSPA!!!


